If this is your first time on Academic Warning, you must complete the required online [Academic Support Module \(ASM\)](#) designed to guide your academic progress. If you have already completed the ASM in prior semesters, you do not need to complete it again. If you have completed the ASM and still have a hold for it, please contact [your academic advisor](#).

In order to familiarize yourself with these services and connect with an advisor, please complete the [ASM](#). The deadline to complete the ASM is two weeks prior to the first day of the semester for which you plan to enroll. Completing the online module will allow you to register for future semesters.

I recommend you also [make an appointment](#) with your [Academic Advisor](#) who can help you develop strategies to get back on track. In the meantime, I encourage you to watch this [video from a fellow student](#) learn more about their experience with Academic Warning.
